Spirituality: A Systematic practice of and reflection on a prayerful, devout, and disciplined Christian life. In its practice, Christian spirituality has always called for an ascetical and <u>prayerful life in which a spiritual guide and the light of the Holy Spirit help discern the direction in which individuals and communities are being led (1 Thessalonians 5:19–22; 1 John 4:1). Schools or styles of spirituality have often followed the charisms of such orders as the Benedictines, Carmelites, Carthusians, Dominicans, Franciscans, and Jesuits. As a field of study, spirituality involves theological (including liturgical), scriptural, historical, psychological, and social elements. Gerald O'Collins and Edward G. CCC 2559 *humility* is the foundation of prayer.

CCC 2562 According to Scripture, it is the *heart* that prays.

CCC 2564 Christian prayer is a covenant relationship between God and man in Christ.

CCC 2565 In the New Covenant, prayer is the living relationship of the children of God with their Father who is good beyond measure, with his Son Jesus Christ and with the Holy Spirit.

Romans 1:9

For God is my witness, whom I serve with my spirit in the gospel of his Son, that without ceasing I mention you always in my prayers,

Romans 8:26

Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness; for <u>we do not know how to pray as we ought</u>, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us with sighs too deep for words.

Romans 10:1

Brethren, my heart's desire and <u>prayer to God for them</u> is that they may be saved.

Romans 12:12

Rejoice in your hope, be patient in tribulation, be constant in prayer.

Romans 15:30

I appeal to you, brethren, by our Lord Jesus Christ and by the love of the Spirit, to strive together with me in your prayers to God on my behalf,

1 Corinthians 14:15

What am I to do? I will pray with the spirit and I will pray with the mind also; I will sing with the spirit and I will sing with the mind also.

2 Corinthians 1:11

You also must help us by prayer, so that many will give thanks on our behalf for the blessing granted us in answer to many prayers.

while they long for you and pray for you, because of the surpassing grace of God in you.

<u>praying earnestly night and day</u> that we may see you face to face and supply what is lacking in your faith?

pray constantly,

Brethren, pray for us.

2 Thessalonians 1:11

To this end we always pray for you, that our God may make you worthy of his call, and may fulfil every good resolve and work of faith by his power,

2 Thessalonians 3:1

Finally, brethren, pray for us, that the word of the Lord may speed on and triumph, as it did among you,

1 Timothy 2:1

First of all, then, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings <u>be made for</u> all men,

1 Timothy 2:8

I desire then that in every place the men should pray, lifting holy hands without anger or quarreling;

for then it is consecrated by the word of God and prayer.
